QAS LIFE MEMBER JULIE BALLIS PROFILE

DRAWING or painting people has always been my passion. As a child I would follow my family around pestering them to be painted.

My grandfather wrote in my book that "Julie draws and draws without a pause!" My parents influenced my love of colour and live theatre and use of music as a background aid to painting. Dad would enlist my services to help him paint colourful backdrops for his dance band and amateur theatre productions, which was fun.

At my high school in Sydney art was only considered half a subject and I had to drop four class levels to be able to study it in my second year. After leaving school I studied art at the National Institute of Art in Sydney for three years, with teachers including Lindsay Churchland. I was introduced to oils at art school, and they remain my favourite medium. My inspirations come from artists such as Sargent, Renoir, Velasquez and Gauguin. I met the late Everett Raymond Kinstler and the late Richard Schmidt whilst in the US and am inspired by their works too.

When my husband and I moved to Canberra there was little time for art whilst raising my family. I eventually joined art societies such as QAS, ASOC, CAW and Tuggeranong Art Society and attended workshops and classes, studying with various artists including Peg Minty, Paul Newton, Dolan Lansley, Yve Close and former Archibald Prize winner Joshua Smith. I also joined new Sydney-based group Portrait Artists Australia (PAA) in 2002 and the Portrait Society of America (PSA).

PAA membership provided opportunities to have my portraits of local MPs Steve Whan and Peter Webb hung in exhibitions in Parliament House Sydney; portraits of Queanbeyan personality the late Reverend Mary Thorn and Nobel Prize winner Prof Brian Schmidt exhibited in Parliament House Canberra; and my portrait of Australian actress Sibylla Budd exhibited with about 35 other Australian paintings at the Australian Embassy in Washington DC in 2005. My painting had been a finalist in the Shirley Hannan National Portrait Competition in 2004. This exhibition was viewed by artists attending the PSA's annual conference in America.

The Prof Schmidt painting now resides at the ANU's Research School of Astronomy and Astrophysics, my painting of Mary Thorn is at Queanbeyan's Anglican Christ Church and my portrait of world squash icon and local girl Heather McKay is hanging in the Heather McKay Indoor Sports Centre in Queanbeyan.

Portrait painting provided an excellent means of meeting many interesting people. Other public figures I have painted include Australian rugby league icon Mal Meninga, Queanbeyan's former Mayor Tim Overall, former Fiji High Commissioner Jioji Konrote, Australian journalist and school friend Shirley Stott Despoja from Adelaide and, more recently, the current Member of Parliament for Eden Monaro Kristy McBain.

I held a solo exhibition at The Q in Queanbeyan in 2009 and two years later had another exhibition at The Q with my neighbour and fellow artist Kay Watts. I am also represented in two published books, 'The Artists' Book, Portrait Artists Australia – Ten Years 2012', and 'Queanbeyan City of Champions', written by Nicole Overall in 2013.

Teaching others to paint has been a great way to help me with my painting. I held quarterly portrait workshops for ASOC for approximately ten years and conducted a Friday morning portraiture class at QAS for six years. It was an honour for me to also be President of the QAS for four years to 2002 and to also serve as a member of the Queanbeyan City Council's Cultural Advisory Committee over this period.

QUEANBEYAN HISTORY

THE Old Kent Hotel Queanbeyan looking quite spick and span, on the corner down from the QAS Gallery.

Shows the old bridge and how the road off the bridge curved to the right to then travel down Macquoid St which was the Main Street into Queanbeyan from the east. This looks like the 1950/60's, by the cars.

In 1975 the new bridge was built and the road pushed through, straightened as it is now.

O'Neill cottage had the wrecking ball poised over its head, when **Hope Marland**, Queanbeyan Councillor, suggested to the **Mayor David Madew**, that the Art Society was looking for a premises and maybe this would be a good spot. Well she was right!After it had been restored by QAS members, Rotaract, Qbn Council. Member **Trevor Hardy**, a builder, and his son Chris got into the serious building repairs and did a great job.

Amazing little dirt road that came down to the cottage then!

The Kent Hotel was built for William Hunt as an elaborate inn in 1849-50. The inn contains a ballroom, 12 large bedrooms, 13 parlours and a stone cellar.

Perhaps the reason the road off the bridge turned was because Hunt owned all the land to the river (past the cafe, toilets, and to the big weir) They went around his land.



CHARLES SLUGA WORKSHOP

QAS July mixing it up with Watercolour workshop was a lot of fun for all of the participants. Water Colour isn't the easiest of mediums but all of the participants enjoyed the opportunity to work on their own projects and undertake some class exercises. **Charles Sluga** was very generous with his time and gave group tutorials and one on one mentoring. His simple and effective method of painting people was a highlight for some and others liked his vibrant undercoating before building top layers in a landscape.

**QAS MEMBER STUART WISCOMBE**

I came to pastel painting quite late in the day.

My poor artistic achievements at school convinced me that I had no artistic ability.

I wonder how many people have had a similar experience? About 4 years ago, I posed the question to my wife Susan, that given I had neat handwriting, surely this control of the pen should transfer to drawing? Susan encouraged me to sign up for a drawing workshop held by Genevieve Swifte, an award winning contemporary artist. My first attempts were far from remarkable but Genevieve's encouraging approach to mark making ignited an interest which led me to a second workshop. It wasn't long before I wanted to introduce colour into my pencil and charcoal drawings which prompted me to experiment with a small set of hard pastels. Finding them a pleasant medium, I decided to seek tuition in their correct use and attended a workshop with master pastellist, Ellouise Theron. I have Ellouise to thank for launching me on the pastel journey that I have been enjoying ever since.

I typically paint from photographs on my iPad, which affords me the ability to enlarge the image to view the detail. Wherever possible, I like to work from photographs that I have taken as they provide me a more intimate understanding of the subject and the narrative I want to evoke. I'm a relatively slow painter, typically taking a couple of months to complete a piece. I enjoy painting a variety of subject matter and would classify myself a realist painter.



I have been a member of QAS for just over twelve months and feel very fortunate to have been warmly accepted into such a vibrant and friendly artist community.




